4. Admission and Migration

General Rules:

1. Admission will be strictly on fulfilment of eligibility conditions.
2. H.P. University has started Semester system under NEP-2020 from 2026-27 and Annual System will be remain unchanged for 2nd and 3rd years students
3. Aadhar Card number should be written in the admission form.
4. Any gap in academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence.
5. Applicants who have passed Prabhakar are not eligible for admission.
6. Candidate coming from Boards other than H.P. Board of School Education must produce Migration Certificate in original.
7. A student's admission is liable to be cancelled if he/she provides incomplete, incorrect, or false information, or conceals any relevant facts. Appropriate disciplinary action shall also be taken against such a candidate.
8. Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the principal can refuse admission if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark during the previous year.
9. Initially, all admissions will be provisional and subject to the final approval by H. P. University.
10. A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid down by H.P. University.
11. Students placed under compartment in 10+2 class will not be eligible for admission to the B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. 1st year of the three-year degree course.
12. Girl students seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of H.P. Bonafide certificate to avail the fee concession.
13. Handicapped students seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificate from Medical Board.
14. The students who have appeared in 1st year & 2nd year can take Roll-on admission in 2nd year & 3rd year without waiting for the declaration of results.
15. The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.

5. Eligibility for Admission

1. A student who is clear-cut pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P. Board of School Education or any examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the H.P. University. A student placed under compartment in 10+2 will not be eligible for admission in any UG level course under CBCS-UGC (RUSA) and NEP-2020
 - i) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given admission to B.Sc. programme.
 - ii) Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Commerce stream and students with Mathematics or Economics shall be eligible to seek admission to B.Com. Programme under the following provisions:
 - A. Candidate seeking admission in B. Com 1st Semester must have secured 45% marks in 10+2 in aggregate with Math/Economics as one of the compulsory subject at 10+2 level or 45% in aggregate for student from relevant vocational stream.
 - B. The minimum percentage is 40% for those students who have passed 10+2 under Commerce group.
 - C. Further a student taking admission in B.A 1st Semester with Mathematics as one of subject should have secured either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% in Mathematics at 10+2 level.
2. Twice failed student in the same exam will not be admitted.
3. An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on 01-07-2026 and must not have been born earlier to 01-07-2002. However, in case of over age candidates, the Vice Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to six months. In case of Schedule Caste/Schedule Tribe, student's relaxation up to three years is allowed as per rules.

6. Admission Procedure

1. Students have to fill online admission form through College Website <https://www.gcbeetan.co.in/>
2. After filling out the admission form online, the student must appear before the Admission Committee along with the required documents for verification and submission.
3. Once the forms have been duly processed and signed by the concerned Admission Committee, the student shall deposit the annual admission fee through the online payment gateway. Thereafter, upon submission of the fee receipt and a passport-size photograph, the identity card will be issued by the library.

7. NEP-2020 (Only for 1st and 2nd Sem)

Admissions as per National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

1. Admissions to Undergraduate (UG) programmes for the session 2026-27 shall be commencing in accordance with the provisions of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.
2. The curricular and credit framework under NEP-2020 facilitate multiple entry and exit options with a UG certificate/UG diploma/or degree, depending upon the number of credits secured.
3. Admission to the first year shall be implemented under NEP 2020 from the current academic session. However, students in the second and third years shall continue under the existing Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and follow the previous scheme of study.

7 A. CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

BA/ B.Com/ B.Sc 2nd and 3rd Year

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective/minor or skill-based courses. The courses can be evaluated following the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks system. Therefore, it is necessary to introduce a uniform grading system in the entire higher education system in India. This will benefit the students to move across institutions within India to begin with and across countries. The uniform grading system will also enable potential employers in assessing the performance of the candidates. In order to bring uniformity in the evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on students' performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Choice Based Credit System:

1. **Core Course (Language Based Subjects & ENVS):** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

2. **Elective Course (DSC):** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/ subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline /subject of study referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by the main discipline /subject of study).

2.2 **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

3. **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses/ Skill Development Courses/Foundation Course:** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Course (AECC) and AE Elective Course (AEEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. They ((i) Environmental Science, (ii) English/MIL Communication) are mandatory for all disciplines. AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills.

Courses in UG Programmes:

The UG (TDC) programmes in a college affiliated to the HPU will comprise of the following categories of courses: -

1. Core Compulsory Courses (12 Courses x 06 Credits each =72 Credits)
2. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) (02 Courses x 04 Credits each =08 Credits)
3. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (04 Courses x 04 Credits each = 16 Credits)
4. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) (04Courses x 06 Credits each =24 Credits)
5. Generic Elective (GE) (02 Courses x 06 Credits each =12 Credits)

7 B. Choosing Programme Study Course:

1. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounts for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course, whereas, End Semester Examination (ESE) accounts for the remaining 70% of the final grade that a student gets in a course.
 2. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): This would have the following components
 - a. Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures /Tutorials / Practical. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End Semester Examination (ESE)

9 B. Fees/Funds/Fines

1. a) Every students must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time.
- b) A student will have to pay the entire fee for the session in one instalment at the time of Admission.
- c) Failure to pay dues on date will entail a fine of Rs.10/- per day.
- d) In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of the student will be struck off from the college rolls at the end of the month.
- e) Registration fee will not be charged from the student migrating from another college if he/she is already registered with HP University. Other dues will be charged accordingly as per rules.
2. The name of a student will be struck off from the college if he/she remains absent without leave continuously for ten days in any class/subject (Theory/Practical).
3. In case the name of a candidate is struck off, the re-admission is permissible within first 10 days with a first re-admission fee of Rs. 100/- on a prescribed Performa. If a candidate fails to seek re-admission within first 15 days then he/she should seek re-admission up to 20 days on payment of Rs. 200/- as second re-admission fee on the personal presence of parent /guardian. After 20 days from the date his/her name is struck off there will be no re-admission in any case.
4. Every student will have to produce No Dues Certificate from the Library, NSS, Sports, College Canteen, Fee Clerk etc. if he/she wants to leave the college.
5. The Principal can expel a student from the college if he/she is found guilty of misconduct/ indiscipline/ragging.
6. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.
7. The fine for absence has to be paid along with dues, while fine imposed otherwise have to be deposited by the date announced, in the college office/fee counter.
8. Contribution towards PTA funds Rs. 500/- per year for UG students (to be paid at the time of admission). However, for students seeking admission to M.A. English, PTA Fund Rs.600/- per semester (to be paid at the time of admission).
9. No tuition fee is charged from the Bonafide Himachali girl students, subject to production of H.P. Bonafide Certificate at the time of admission.
10. Students having more than 40% disability are exempted from tuition fee.
11. Migration Fee (from other Board): Rs. 400/-

10. PG Programme (Admission to M.A. English)

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

Number of Seats: 30 Subsidised Seats

Basis of Admission and Eligibility:

The admission will be made strictly on the basis of marks obtained in Entrance Test (conducted by H.P. University) as well on the merit worked out on the basis of the academic record of the student. The test will be open to all with any graduate degree such as B.A./B.Sc./B. Com of University established by law in India with at least Second division in aggregate or 45% marks in the subject or Honours in the subject of study for M.A. For SC/ST candidates the eligibility will be 45% in aggregate or 40% marks in the subject or Honours in the subject of study for M.A. The Entrance Test will be of 80 marks and 20 marks will be given to the past academic record of the student as under:

1. Marks for aggregate in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com., etc. 10% of the marks scored.
2. Marks for aggregate of English in 3 years in Bachelor's degree 10% of the marks scored.
3. Marks for score in class XII 5% of the marks scored.
4. Marks for score in class X 5% of the marks scored

The minimum qualifying marks in the Entrance Test will be 35% to make the candidates eligible for interview/ admission. In case of SC/ST candidates, the minimum qualifying marks shall be reduced until the full SC/ST quota for admission has been exhausted.

Reservation: Reservation for various categories will be provided as per the University Rules. However, there shall no reservation for the Non-Subsidised Seats and the admission shall be solely on merit as per clause 21.

Age Limit: As per University Rules applicable to other Masters' Degree Programmes of the University, 26 years for boys and 28 years for girls (29 years for SC/ST boys and girls) as on 01-07-2021

12. Leave Rules

a) General Leave Rules

1. Students can proceed on leave with prior permission. For this, they should duly fill in the leave form or get their application sanctioned from the subject teachers and the Principal as per guidelines given below:
2. Leave up to 6 days is to be recommended by concerned course teachers and sanctioned by Head of Department of major subject of the student. For more duration i.e. up to 10 days, a student must get a leave application signed by the Principal.
3. Leave during House Examination/Class Test will be sanctioned only by the Principal on the recommendation of the Head of Department.
4. Leave for long sickness periods (beyond a week's time) must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

b) Duty Leave Rules

Participation by the students in Sports/Cultural/NSS/Co-curricular activities, Inter-College/University Competitions shall be considered as duty leave for the period of respective competition(s), Duty leave, however, shall only be allowed if recommended by the concerned activity in-charge prior proceeding to the event.

13. Mid Term Exam and Attendance Criteria

All students are required to appear in the Mid-Term Test (MTT), which is tentatively scheduled to be conducted in the first week of December. Since a portion of the students' Internal Assessment is based on their performance in the MTT examination, it is mandatory for every student to appear in this test. Besides that, the students are required to be punctual and regular in their classes. According to the University rules every student must attend 75% lectures both in theory & practical separately failing which his/her examination form could be put on hold by the college. However, the Principal can condone the actual participated days in every course including practical in respect of those students who had missed their classes on account of their participation in NSS/Sports/Cultural/Academic Activities or due to some medical exigency (Medical Certificate Required).

14. Library

The library of SDWG Government College Beetan serves as an essential academic resource centre, providing students and faculty with a well-structured and conducive environment for learning and research. The library is thoughtfully organized ensuring easy access to books and study materials. It is equipped with computers and internet facility that enables users to search and utilize resources efficiently. It has a fairly good collection of books and has different sections for textbooks and reference books. The library also subscribes to four hindi and two english newspapers on a regular basis. Students are encouraged to use the library during working hours on all working days.

Rules:

1. Library cum Identity card will be issued by the librarian within the 15 days of admission and every student is required to obtain his/her library cum identity card.
2. Books are issued on the Library cum identity card, and the student must produce the card every time he/she visits the library
3. Two books will be issued on the identity card for 14 days.
4. Reference books will not be issued.
5. Delay in return of book on due date, a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day will be imposed.
6. If a book is mutilated/defaced/lost by the student, the cost of book will have to be deposited along with fine.

15. Co-Curricular and Extra Curricular Activities

Sports: The College provides facilities to sports persons and the teams are prepared for Intra-college, Inter-college and University championships. Annual Athletic Meet is also organised in the college every year to promote the sports culture.

Cultural: The students get ample opportunity to excel in cultural activities of their choice viz-Debate, Declamation, Quiz, Painting, Poster making, Collage, Rangoli, Music (V & I), Dance, Drama, Skit and mime etc. Aspiring students are also motivated to take part in HPU Youth Festival GP-I, II, III & IV on the basis of their performance in the college level cultural events and competitions.

NSS: The College has one unit of NSS consisting of 100 volunteers. The enrolment is made every year on the basis of a regular selection procedure. The students learn several life skills and dutifulness towards society by associating themselves with NSS. Several one-day camps and a special seven-day camp is a regular feature of its yearly working schedule.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The College has been allotted a half unit of 50 cadets (Boys & Girls) from the session 2021- 2022. The NCC unit of the college plays an important role in developing discipline, leadership, patriotism, and a spirit of social service among students. Through various training programmes, camps, parades, and community service activities, cadets are encouraged to build confidence and character. 16. Conduct and Discipline

The Principal can impose fine, suspension or even rusticate any student who is found indulging in such acts of misconduct as are listed below:

1. a) Any act of ragging in the campus will be severely dealt with. Ragging implies harassment /physical or mental torture to any other student by a student or a group of students. Any student found associated in such unlawful activities will be guilty of gross misconduct. Remember, ragging is a cognizable offence.
- b) Anybody found guilty or writing obscene language on black boards, walls or furniture.
- c) Aimlessly loitering in the campus/courtyard, raising noise or attempts to disturb classes.
- d) Smoking or taking drugs/alcohol etc. in the campus/canteen premises.
- e) Any attempt to damage the furniture or other property in the campus.
- f) Bringing unwanted outsiders to the campus or sitting unnecessarily in the canteen or within the campus.
- g) Playing in the stadium without the permission of the Principal.
- h) Pasting posters on the walls or on the Notice Board without the permission of the Principal.
2. Students who intend to participate in sports or other extra- curricular activities/educational tour must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.
3. Every student must carry with him/her identity card which is issued to him/her at the time of admission. He/she must also produce the identity card whenever demanded by any teacher or the principal.
4. Parents/guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college.

17. Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

The body is elected for every academic year/session to assist and draw the attention of the college administration towards the prime issues related to welfare of the students as well as of the Institution. The Association works as per the approved guidelines provided in PTA Charter/ Constitution.

18. Ragging: A Punishable Offence

Ragging means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power of senior students is brought to bear on the freshly enrolled or in any way considered junior by other students which involves physical and psychological assault or threat to other students or use of force or violation of dignity and honour of such students or expose students to ridicule and affect their self-esteem or entail verbal abuse, aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.

Any student found involved in ragging will be punished strictly by the college authorities and such penalization may include:

1. Expulsion from the college.
2. Suspension from the classes.
3. Fine with a public apology.
4. Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
5. Debarring from the representation in events.
6. Legal proceedings under criminal law shall be initiated. It includes imprisonment for a term which may extend to 3 years or with fine which may extend to 50,000/- or with both.
